W e took delivery of a new car recently; a compact SUV. The technology in modern cars is astounding. There are more cameras onboard than in a Hollywood movie lot, including a side-mounted one to prevent kerb scraping the wheels. It has a radar system to monitor blind spots and to maintain a safe distance from the car in



front when cruising. It will tell you if it thinks you are straying from your lane by vibrating the steering wheel and even correct the steering for you. And it will apply the brakes if it thinks you are in danger of rear ending someone.

Will these systems create a lazier or less attentive driver who comes to rely on technology rather than one's spatial awareness, eyes and ears? I guess only time will tell, but wouldn't it be a hoot to have Cecil Kimber "beamed up" to 2015 and hear his thoughts on the progress on motoring since his days at Morris Garages.

<u> Vale – Leo Geoghegan</u>

I am sure many members would remember the exploits of brothers Ian and Leo Geoghegan from the heyday of Australian motor sport in the 50's, 60's and 70's. Real legends they were. It is with great sadness that I advise the passing on 2 March 2015 of Leo Geoghegan. Leo's passing ends a lengthy battle with prostate cancer.



Leo was 78 and started his motor racing career in 1956 driving an early model Holden. Throughout this career he captured an extensive range of titles including the 1970 Australian Drivers Championship, the 1960 Australian GT Championship, the 1963 Australian Formula Junior Championship and the 1973-74 Australian F2 Championship 1973-74, also shared second place in the 1967 Gallaher 500 with his famous brother, Ian. Leo capped an outstanding career with victory in the international Japan Grand Prix of 1969, driving the Lotus 39-Repco V8. Geoghegan and Lotus enjoyed a close association for many years and was renowned for the superb presentation of the team.

1782bhp, 1475lb ft of Torque and no Gearbox

Imagine and MGB like that.....!!

Although not directly related to MG's (except for the exhilaration you get when you are behind the steering wheel of one), I thought this was very interesting from a technology and sign of the times perspective.

I t is time to reconfigure everything you thought you knew about the way cars work! The **Koenigsegg Regera** has a 5.0-litre twinturbocharged V8, three electric motors, and a new 'Direct Drive' transmission. Koenigsegg wants in on the hybrid hypercar action, and if the performance fig-



ures are anything to go by, it'll blow its opponents out of the water. Here we have a big ol' V8 working with a trio of electric motors, and a new transmission technology that does away with the need for hefty gearboxes.

So before we get too technical, more on those highly impressive performance figures. This is Koenigsegg's first hybrid; the internal combustion





engine side is taken care of by a 5.0litre twin-turbocharged V8, which makes 1085bhp at 7800rpm on its own. On top of that you've got three electric motors, one on each rear wheel making 192lb ft of torque each, and a third on the crankshaft making 221lb ft. All told these three add about 700bhp. Chuck that all in a bowl and mix it together for a frankly incredible 1782bhp and 1475lb ft of torque.

What makes the Regera special though, is that it has a new style of transmission called Koenigsegg Direct Drive. Compared with traditional transmissions and CVTs, it cuts energy losses by up to 50 per cent. We can't wait to get a proper technical breakdown of how it works, but in layman's terms the system uses a hydraulic clutch. You pull away using the rear-mounted electric motors, and as speed increases the engine is slowly brought into play with the help of the crank-mounted motor. Clever stuff.

Power delivery is so intense that the

0-62mph sprint takes 2.7sec, but it could be quicker - the car is essentially limited by its traction control system being able to get the power down. Once it's hooked up, though, there's no stopping it: 0-186mph takes 12 seconds, while 0 -250mph is despatched in

under 20 seconds. 93mph to 155mph takes 3.2sec. *Three. Point. Two. Seconds.* That is mind scrambling pace.

The exterior doesn't have the same aggressive elegance of the Agera this car is based on, but it's no less of a technological marvel. There are massive side scoops, an active chassis with active shock absorbers, active aero under the car and an adjustable rear wing.

That's a lot of of incredible technology and impressive ingenuity, so naturally it ain't cheap. £1.2m, or \$2.36m (Aus), depending on where you live. That's a small price to pay for some Swedish madness, though.



Here is an interesting video with the owner / designer of the Koenigsegg Regera with an insight in to how this car came about, and the technology that has enabled it's manufacture.

leagues were not prepared to risk their machinery with little time for repairs if something did go awry.

And it did go pear-shaped for two of my fellow competitors; A TR6 which had a range of fuel supply/fuel injection issues that couldn't be solved even though the cars was taken back to a specialist in Picton overnight and a Porsche 911 3.0 Carrera that lost its entire 12ltr of engine oil spread evenly around the track. He came to a grinding halt just after the "fish hook" or "gurgler" (turn 8) and before turn 9 with a seized engine. And to make matters worse it was raining at the time with rivers running across the track in many corners.



Geoff Morgan, another of the Group S drivers and also Porsche mounted, commented on Sunday morning that it was the worst conditions he had ever driven in on the track even worse than during torrential rain at the nurbergring when he was racing a Porsche Cup car in a 1000km race. And Geoff is no mean racer having won many prestigious events includ-

In the rain my times tumbled from the high 1:12's to 1:32's and when the oil mixed with the water on lap 3 the best I, or indeed any of the competitors could do, was in the 1:43's!
